### **AOS Judging at POS**

I'm sure we've all had the experience of going to an orchid show and seeing blue ribbons on the showiest plants, and then seeing a plant right next to the showy plant with no ribbon at all, but an AOS award. Well, we'll have the chance to learn about different types of judging and understand how this occurs.

Of course, orchid judges for the AOS look for something different when judging flowers than do the ribbon judges for a society show, and this month we'll be able to see AOS judging in action. There will be two or three AOS judging teams set up to judge and score plants, and the local AOS judging chairman, Maynard Michel, will explain the overall process. As judging starts, members will gather around the individual judging groups to see the process in detail.

Because AOS judging is supposed to be an anonymous process, there are a couple things we'll need to do for this meeting that are different than usual. First, please bring in plants for the show-and-tell table as usual, especially if you think the flowers are exceptional for that particular type of orchid, but please don't stop to tell any of the judges about your

plant as you do this. If a judge knows that a particular plant belongs to a specific person, they must excuse themselves from judging that plant.

The meeting will commence at 7:30 this month, and after announcements, we'll start the judging process immediately. Any plants where judging has been specifically requested will be judged – forms will be at the meeting for requesting judging. Also, the show-and-tell table will be viewed by the judges to see if there are additional plants they feel worthy of a closer look. Once judging is finished, we'll have a short break, introduce the awarded plants and the show-and-tell table, and then proceed with the raffle.

If the judges award your plant, then that's wonderful. If you don't get an award, that doesn't mean your plant isn't exceptional, only that the judges are looking at attributes of a plant and flower which may be different than you see when you look at the flower. Especially with orchids, beauty is very much in the eye of the beholder.

I urge you to take advantage of this opportunity to get plants AOS judged without having to go to San Francisco or Oakland. Hopefully, we'll all learn more about AOS judging, see some special plants, and have fun in the process! See you there, Ken Jacobsen

#### Editor's corner

The repotting season is upon us once again - not that it actually comes to a complete halt. The worst aspect of my orchid culture is repotting. Not that I don't know how, just that I don't make the time for it. Since I don't do it often, I don't keep potting mix or sphagnum moss moistened - or it tends to have partially rotted by the time I get to it. So, when I have time to repot, I find that I don't have any

moistened potting mix, so it will have to be next weekend . . .

While I was looking for a job - oops, in transition is considered the correct term these days - I did set a goal of repotting everything that needed it. And almost succeeded. Two of the phrags I repotted are pictured to the right. (Yes, different gloves for handling each plant.) They had both been repotted at the same time previously. The one in the top photo took over an hour to untangle the roots and remove the potting mix - the roots had interwoven. The one on the bottom took less than 5 minutes from taking it out of the pot to putting it back in with new mix. This is a lesson to me in paying attention to how well the orchids are growing and repotting on an "as needed" basis. Some experts recommend repotting phrags every 6 months. Probably not a bad idea - wish I would do it. It's a lot more fun - and less time consuming - to repot at the right time.

In place of the April meeting we will have a potting clinic at Sue Rose's house on April 25th. (This is due to lack of availability of the Garden Center on our usual meeting date.) So plan to come over to Sue's house in Palo Alto and discover different types of potting media, when the best time is to repot your particular types of orchids, and bring a difficult plant along to see if you can trick someone else into doing the hard parts.







#### PRODUCT REVIEW - BUBBLE WRAP INSULATION FROM CHARLIE'S GREENHOUSE

This is not a Consumer's Report type review - there has been no careful scientific test protocol executed. This is just my experience with the Charlie's Greenhouse bubble wrap insulation that I put up last fall and over the winter - completely unaided by anyone who has a talent for this type of thing.

I heat my 6x8 ft. wood and double wall polycarbonate greenhouse to 55 degrees with two electric space heaters. One, a 400 watt panel type convection heater bought online and the other a more powerful dual power mode space heater from Ace Hardware. Last year was the first winter there were orchids in the greenhouse. I

caulked and hoped for the best. Near the end of winter I realized, as I




watched mist from the fogger escaping into cold air, that I had missed the all important area between the walls and the roof on the sides. This year I did caulk those areas and close one foot long gap in that area that required a piece of round door insulation to be stuffed

into it before I could caulk. I mention this because some or all of the energy savings I realized could be attributed to remedying this issue.

If you look at the illustration in the Charlie's catalog, you will see the 2 ft. wide insulation fitting neatly over the greenhouse siding into the space between the wooden frames. My greenhouse panels are 2 ft wide, but that includes the wooden framing. I started by cutting out cute little pieces to fit between the wooden framing and adhering it with the double sided tape I had also bought from Charlie's. There were three issues with this method. 1) It takes WAY too much time. 2) The bubble wrap is placed with the bubble side towards the wall and the tape, so the tape strips were not able to hold the bubble wrap on the ceiling panels very well. 3) Even with caulking there are air leaks between the wooden frame pieces - it is good to







What I ended up doing, also suggested as a method in the instructions with the bubble wrap, was to use a desk stapler to staple the pieces in place. I did this with the pieces cut to fit the polycarbonate areas first, then realized I could just run long strips around the walls and down from the roof panels and staple as I went across the wooden frame. This was so much easier, faster, and more effective in keeping the insulation up.

My electricity usage was measurably down from last year. Our house has a gas furnace and gas water heater, so the greenhouse makes up a large part of our winter bill. Also, the first winter the 400 watt panel heater could only heat the greenhouse to 5 degrees above the outside temperature. This year it was able to heat the greenhouse 10 to 12 degrees above the outside temperature.

I plan to take down the insulation next month for the summer and reinstall it in the fall when I clean my greenhouse. It turned out to be worth the effort.

Thanks everyone for taking the time to fill out the membership forms completely. I have been comparing your forms with your information in my address book and correcting errors.
