Auction Plants and Items will be accepted beginning at 4:30 PM. Items must be presented for check-in by 6:30 PM - including pre-registered plants and items. No exceptions.

Particulars about how many plants you can sell or donate, etc. are listed on page 2. Items should arrive for check-in already tagged with their orchid code, your name, and minimum bid (if any). If there is no minimum bid set, then the auctioneer will start your plant at a price they deem reasonable.

If you are interested in donating plants or other items to the auction, but can't make it to the auction or would like someone to come and pick up your donations, please contact Mary Gerritsen at 650-348-6492 (before Oct 14, after that she is out of the country) or Mike Rector at 650-366-3401 (up until the day before the auction).

Plants should be established and must be disease and insect free. Please bring only plants that you would bid on. The POS reserves the right to refuse any plant or supplies offered for auction.

We have been working to ensure that the selection of plants at auction gets better and better each year ... and try to have bidding wind up at a reasonable hour. The plants being offered, that we know of to date, will be worth your making the journey to San Mateo!

You may want to bring a box or two with you, to take home all of your new found treasures.

Refreshments will be served - you are still welcome to bring goodies with you and they will be much appreciated!.

2010 Peninsula Orchid Society Auction

- 1) The total number of lots (single plants, box of plants, books, other related items, or collection of items) not to exceed 250.
- 2) Members may donate or sell (on consignment) up to a total of 20 plants/lots. The maximum number of plants/lot that any member can sell is 10; however, for example if a member wants to donate 15 lots and sell 5, that works too. Or donate 20 and sell 0! You can also combine two or more plants as a single "lot", Please consider donating plants, the proceeds support the POS. Plants are sold on consignment: 25% of the proceeds will go the POS and the owners will receive a 75% check by mail after the auction. All sales are subject to sales tax which will be collected by the POS.
- 3) If at all possible, members should pre-register the plants/lots they want to sell or donate by email to: Dan Williamson email:29205@yahoo.com or Fred Cox sailorfred@yahoo.com, giving the information for each plant that is requested on the form in this newsletter. If you don't have email you can mail the form to Chaunie Langland, 878 Cashew Way, Fremont, CA 94536.
- 4) Closing date for early submission of electronic or RECEIPT of snail mail lists is the MONDAY (October 18) before the auction.
- 5) There will still be the opportunity to bring plants or lots that have not been pre-registered until the maximum number of lots (250) has been reached. The advantage of pre-registering is to generate more interest in your plants as buyers have time to research them, and to be sure that your plants make it into the auction.
 - 6) The POS will accept donations in excess of the 250 cap but will reserve the option to use the donations in opportunity tables at subsequent meetings.
 - 7) **DAY OF THE AUCTION:** Bring your plants with the plant tags already filled out and attached to the pots (or whatever works well for the non-potted plants) and a filled out copy of the auction entry form on page 3. Plants must be entered no later than 6:30PM. Sorry, NO EXCEPTIONS.

Plant tags are available on page 4.

The orchid code is two letters and two digits (no hyphen). Examples: CL01, CL02, CL10.

A tale of Gomesias

Three *Gomesia crispas* were brought to our September meeting. At least, that is what they were labeled. Ron Parsons took a look at them as he presented the Show & Tell table and decided that they were all *Gomesia recurva*. Ron has seen more of these than most of us. One thing I often do when I am labeling the photo pages is to check the species against photos available on www.orchidspecies.com. Fortunately there are not that many Gomesias, because after looking at the photos for crispa and recurva, I decided that our flowers did not match that well and I went through all of the available photos on that site. In the end, I though *Gomesia alpina* fit better. But I wouldn't bet \$10 on it! Ron did not like *alpina* designation though, as he has seen them and said they are white, not green.

It is not easy to determine the correct name of your orchids. The tag can easily be wrong. I bought what was said by the seller (at a commercial greenhouse) to be an Iwanagara Apple Blossom, found the label marked as "Apolo Blossom", and when it bloomed it did not resemble Apple Blossom. There is no "Apolo or Apollo Blossom", at least not on the internet.

It is a good thing to check your blooming plant against photos available on the internet and in books to see if the tag is likely to be correct. You need to allow for variations between plants though. When the results of your investigation are not clear, you need to track down an authority (often available at our regular meetings!) and make a decision on what you are going to go with. In the case of the Gomesias, I would relabel with Ron's identification.

With mis-marked hybrids you are often out of luck - they are just too hard to identify.
