Dan Newman on Growing orchids mounted and out of pots




Epiblastus basalis

People who love to grow orchids are lucky the orchids are so adaptable. No plant naturally evolved to live in a pot, yet that is the way most orchids are cultivated. Many species can be induced to thrive in pots on a bench, but there are significant holdouts that demand special treatment. These include the many types of orchids that send their leafy growths upward but their flowers sideways or downward, those where the vegetative growth extends in the wrong direction for pot culture or otherwise defies containment, and still others that assert their epiphytic nature by refusing to grow well unless their roots are exposed to air and/or light.

Accommodating the needs of these special cases can help the grower maintain a healthier and more diverse collection.

The presentation will offer a look at a sampling of orchid species that benefit from alternatives to traditional pot culture, with discussion of cultural techniques and a brief demonstration, as time permits. A handout with information about sources for "out-of-pot" materials will be available.



Dan Newman grew up in Southern California and first got interested in orchids as a teenager, following a visit to the greenhouse at the Los Angeles County Arboretum. After reading an article in *Sunset* magazine and devouring the few orchid books available at the local public library, he mustered the resources to order three species orchid plants from Orchids by Hausermann in Illinois: *Brassavola cucullata*, *Brassia gireoudiana*, and *Paphiopedilum venustum*, whose exotic shapes and markings in one of the books' illustrations had captivated him. Unfortunately, conditions in his childhood bedroom were not ideal, and those early subjects soon made the ultimate sacrifice, providing an early lesson in how not to grow orchids.

Years later, on a vacation to Hawaii in 1982, Dan bought a tiny hybrid *Dendrobium* seedling at a lei stand in the Honolulu Airport. His bright San Francisco apartment turned out to be a better orchid environment, and when the *Dendrobium* grew up and bloomed for the first time, he was hooked! By 1996 he had 350 orchids in the same one-bedroom apartment, and had developed an appreciation for plants that don't take up much space. That year he moved his orchids to a rented commercial greenhouse in San Francisco. He acquired the diverse species collection of his friend and orchid mentor, Walter Teague, and his hobby evolved into his nursery, Hanging Gardens. Dan started growing orchids full-time in 2000, and soon moved to a larger greenhouse in Pacifica. He currently has 12,000 to 15,000 plants (a very rough estimate). Cool to intermediate growers are easiest in the coastal climate, but he tries to push the envelope as far as it will go. His collection includes a few hybrids but is mostly made up of species, his first love.

Dan is a member of several orchid societies in the bay area including the Peninsula Orchid Society. He joined the San Francisco Orchid Society in 1987, and served as its president in 1996/97. In recent years, he has spoken on various topics at orchid society meetings in California and elsewhere in the U.S.
