Title: Growing Award Winning Cattleyas

Keith Davis was born in California but moved to Mexico with his missionary parents when eight years old in 1959. In 1974 he attended North Carolina State University where he obtained degrees in forestry, horticulture and agricultural education. After school, he moved to Corpus Christi, Texas where he worked on an oil rig and taught horticulture and purchased his first orchid at a yard sale. It was Lc. Molly Tyler FCC which he still has to this day. After moving to Reidsville, NC in 1984, Keith worked 19 years for North Carolina State University as the grounds and greenhouse superintendent at Chinqua-Penn Plantation owned by the university. In 1997, he and his wife Dixie, adopted their only child, April LeeAndra, for which many of his best orchids are named. Keith is now retired and looks after three farms, his greenhouse full of orchids and helps with a new grandson named Bentley.

In August of 2002, a disaster struck his orchid collection when the power went off at the greenhouse he was leasing. The temperature soared to over 130 degrees and about

90% of his large collection of mainly cattleya alliance orchids was lost. Thanks to many friends, the generosity of orchid growers far and wide and his breeding program, Keith is well on his way back to having a respectable collection again.

Much information for his programs comes from personal experience, research, trial and error, and gleaning from a host of orchid growers through the years. Keith enjoys the “hunt” for those rare and hard to find plants and gladly helps other growers out.

Keith’s talk is entitled GROWING AWARD WINNING CATTLEYAS. Ever wonder how some growers seem to have “all the luck” with their plants getting awards? Well, it is not so much luck as it is skill in knowing how to grow those plants, how to prepare the plants and blooms ahead of time and initial selection of plants to grow for possible awards. Awards can be had on the society show table, an orchid show where hundreds of people will view your plants, or even with the AOS judging system. Some growers just enjoy the blooms for their own satisfaction which is more rewarding if the blooms are of award quality. This talk will cover these topics and many other cardinal rules on growing award winning cattleyas. A handout will be provided with points of topic.

Ghost Orchid



Ghost orchids, the extremely rare flowers known for their pale ethereal bloom, had never before been bred in captivity. Orchid enthusiasts pursue the plant with such fervor they had even attempted to grow them using a procedure similar to invitro fertilization, and many are collected illegally. However, Keith Davis,

who graduated from NCSU in 1979, has recently discovered how to grow and protect the endangered flower.

Auction Tips

The Show & Tell Table at each meeting is free advertising. Most of the auction bidders come to our monthly meetings. If you plan to divide your blooming orchid prior to the auction, just write “**AUCTION**” on the show & tell label and the person describing it will emphasize this to the audience.

More is not always better. Selling a couple of divisions of the same plant is fine, but selling more than three of the exact same thing risks saturating the market and driving down your auction prices. Also, bigger plants command higher prices, up to a point. Not everyone has room for a giant orchid, or even the strength to lift it.

Sentiment has no place at the auction. Your very first orchid may be special to you, but bidders will not care. The same goes for orchids you rescued and nursed back to health. Be proud of your accomplishments, but don't expect bidders to pay up for them.

Keep photographing your orchids as they bloom. These photos will be your strongest promotional device if your plant isn't in bloom at the auction.

Directions 280 South from San Francisco: Take the Eastmoore exit and veer to the right onto Sullivan Avenue. At the stop light, make a right onto Washington Street (service station on the right and Krispy Kream Donut at opposite corner). Go over the freeway, through Junipero Serra Blvd to San Pedro (Catholic Church at intersection). Make a left onto San Pedro and continue through Mission Street between Bank of America and Wendy's. At the stop sign, make a left onto 1st Avenue. Greenhouse is on the right hand side of the 3rd house with the red garage and a sign reading Demattei Nursery. Enter the gate of the chain link fence with red lattice on the left hand side of the red garage.

Directions 280 north of Hicky Blvd.: Take the Pacifica/Eastmoore Avenue exit and veer to the right to the Eastmoore Avenue exit. At the stop light, you would like to be on the 2nd lane to the left. Turn left onto Junipero Serra Blvd and at the stop light; make a right turn onto San Pedro Road. Then continue through Mission Street between Bank of America and Wendy's. At the stop sign, make a left onto 1st Avenue. Greenhouse is on the right hand side of the 3rd house with the red garage and a sign reading Demattei Nursery. Enter the gate of the chain link fence with red lattice on the left hand side of the red garage.

Please drive safely. Limited street parking so please car pool. Do not park within the chain link fence.
